You need to place your C1LB+ base within 1.5 metres of the mains power and telephone wall socket so that the cables will reach. The socket-outlet should be installed near the equipment and

Make sure that it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference. Your C1LB+ works by sending radio signals between the handset and base. The strength of the signal depends on where you place the base. Placing it as high as possible ensures the best

HANDSET RANGE

The unit has a range of up to 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the base and handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and the handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 50 metres. Thick concrete and stone walls can severely affect the range.

SIGNAL STRENGTH The Υ icon on your handset indicates that you are within range of the base. When out of range of the base, the Υ icon flashes. If you are on a call, you will hear a warning beep.

The line will hang up if the handset moves out of range of the base. Move closer to the base. The handset will automatically reconnect to the base.

The base station must be plugged into the mains power at all times. Do not connect the

BATTERY PERFORMANCE

In ideal conditions, fully charged batteries should give up to 6.5 hours talk time or up to 135 hours standby time on a single charge.

Note that new batteries do not reach their full capacity until they have been put to normal use for several days To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the base for a few hours at a

time.

Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible. The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, giving the handset less talk / standby time. Eventually they will need to be replaced. After charging your handset for the first time, subsequent charging time is about 6-8 hours a day.


